TOP STORYLINES

- The Jackets are 21-4 for the first time in 14 seasons (2011) and are ranked in Perfect Game (No. 19) and D1 Baseball (No. 25) for the first time since 2022.
- Tech is outscoring opponents 33-11 in the final three innings over the last 12 games and have not trailed in a game since March 16 vs. Pitt.
- The Yellow Jackets are coming off a series sweep at Notre Dame, its first road sweep in conference play since 2022. Tech outscored Notre Dame 37-14 over those three games
- Head Coach Danny Hall is one of the Top 10 winningest coaches in Division I history - 1,432 wins - 2nd most among active coaches - behind only South Carolina's Paul Mainieri
- · Georgia Tech has replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with two head coaches in the Top 10 for career wins - also Jim Morris (5th - 1,594 - at Tech from 1982-93)
- Tech is led by reigning National Freshman of the Year, Drew Burress. He leads all of D I with a .788 career slugging %.
- The Houston Co. product became the fastest Yellow Jacket in program history to reach 30 career home runs – doing so in just 73 games, a full 20 games faster than the previous record holder, and 1st round draft pick, Kevin Parada
- GT leads the nation in doubles (76) and doubles per game (3.04) - the program record is 2.51, set in the 1987 season.
- The Jackets are the only team in Division I with 4 players at 10+ doubles, led by **Drew Burress** (13) & **Kyle Lodise** (13),

- as well as Kent Schmidt (11) & Carson Kerce (10).
- Burress and Lodise are third in the nation and tied for the lead among Power 4 players with 13 doubles each.
- The pitching staff is boasting 10.8 strikeouts-per-game over a 1.5 K-per-game improvement to last year (9.2) & the 18th best rate in the nation. Tech has not averaged 10+ Ks since the COVID shortened 2020 season (10.9) and hasn't done it over a complete season this century.
- · That early bullpen success has been spearheaded by Mason Patel who became the first Yellow Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six appearances in a season.
- He allowed his first run of the season after 22.2 innings of scoreless baseball - the best start to a season by any Yellow Jacket this century.
- Patel leads the nation with seven wins and a 0.57 WHIP. He is 2nd in DI in ERA (0.61), 4th in hits allowed per nine (3.94) and leads the ACC with 1.21 walks allowed per nine.
- Freshman Alex Hernandez is the only Power 4 player with a save and at least 7 home runs this season.
- He leads all freshman in HR (8) & RBI (37) after hitting his 2nd grand slam of the season last time out.
- Tech is 1st in the nation in doubles (76), 4th in avg. (.335), 6th in OPS (1.011) and 8th in hits (285) & 9th inruns (243).
- Parker Brosius has stolen 13 out of 13 bags this season, the 5th-most among the Power 4 without being caught.

- The Cardiac Jackets wasted no time returning for 2025, winning opening day by one run, 3-2, after scoring the go-ahead run in the bottom of the eighth after an infield grounder from **Nathan Waugh** gave just enough time for **Drew Burress** to come sliding home from third, despite a 5-man infield from ODU.
- In the 2nd game, Tech fell behind, 3-0 before recording an out, only for the bullpen to come in and pitch 9.0 innings of scoreless ball, striking out a season high 16 and only allowing three base hits. The bullpen kept the game, 3-0, until the bottom of the ninth, when Tech exploded for seven runs, the most scored in a ninth inning in a decade of GT baseball.
- That 7-run 9th inning began with a 5-pitch walk by **Nathan Waugh** before **Vahn Lackey** delivered his 2nd hit of the game to
 put runners at 1st and 2nd. **Alex Hernandez** drew a walk on 4
 pitches to load the bases for **Tyler Neises** who connected on an
 0-1 pitch, driving it into left for a single and cutting the deficit to
 one run, 3-2. **Will Baker** reached on an error when his sacrifice
 bunt was mishandled by the ODU pitcher, loading the bases
 for **Kyle Lodise** who took his second walk of the day to score
 Hernandez and tie the game. The very next batter was **Drew Burress** and he made no mistake, smashing a 1-0 pitch over the
 wall in right for the walk-off opposite field walk-off grand slam.
- The Jackets began ACC play with a pair of ninth-inning rallys to take two of three at Virginia Tech. On Friday, GT had been trailing, 2-3, since the fifth inning but **Carson Kerce** and **Kyle Lodise** led off the inning with walks before being brought home off

singles from **Kent Schmidt** and **Alex Hernandez**, before **Patel** slammed the door in the bottom of the inning to earn the 4-3 win.

- In the series finale, Tech entered the 9th tied, 6-6 and had not scored since the 3rd. John Giesler led off the inning with a four-pitch walk, followed by a 5-pitch walk from Parker Brosius. It was freshman Caleb Daniel who came through in the clutch, launching a ground-rule double to put GT ahead, 7-6. Carson Kerce would drive home Brosius on a SAC fly to add the insurance run before the combination of Brett Barfield and Cooper McMullen shut down the VT bats for the victory and the 1st career save for McMullen.
- This year, GT has come from behind in 10 of its 21 wins.

IT STARTS AT HOME...

- Since 1985, Tech has won a whopping .752 percent of its games at home (1,043-336-1).
- In 31 home games in 2024, Tech has hit .339 with 75 doubles, five triples and 61 home runs for 279 RBI.
- Since 2002, Tech has only hit below .300 at home in two full seasons 2017 and 2021.
- So far in 2025, the Jackets are 14-3 with a .345 average. 57 doubles, two triples and 25 HR for 156 RBI.

DANNY HALL - A LIVING LEGEND


- ABCA Hall of Famer Danny Hall joined the Top-10 winningest Division I coaches in history on March 15, when Tech defeated Pitt, 11-1 (7) - his 1,427th win.
- He became the 11th NCAA Division I coach all-time to reach the 1,400 career win mark on April 14 when Tech defeated then-No. 16 Virginia Tech, 11-7.
- In addition to his career-win milestone, Coach Hall also reached the 1,200 wins at Georgia Tech after defeating No. 9 Duke on May 12, 2024.
- He currently has 1,432 career wins the 2nd most among active NCAA head coaches after South Carolina hired Paul Mainieri (1,522 career wins) this season.
- Hall is 12 wins away from tying Chuck Hartman (1,444 at High Point/Virginia Tech 1959-2006) for the 9th most in Division I history.
- Tech replaced Texas as the only program in Division I with 2 coaches in the all-time top-10 - Jim Morris coached at GT from 1982-93.

OFFENSE

Returning Starters

- Georgia Tech baseball returns four bats from the starting lineup of the 2024 Athens Regional Final: Drew Burress, John Giesler. Parker Brosius and Vahn Lackev.
- 2024 National Freshman of the Year (D1 Baseball/Perfect Game) and National Freshman Hitter of the Year (NCBWA) Drew Burress returns for his sophomore season after delivering one of the greatest freshman seasons in college baseball history last year.
- Burress led Georgia Tech in a myriad of categories last year, including average (.381), home runs (25) and RBI (67), becoming the 12th Yellow Jacket to win Tech's triple crown.
- He set the Georgia Tech record for most assists by an outfielder, gunning down 10 base-runners from center field while also setting the program record with four home runs in a single game, against Georgia State (Feb. 27, 2024).
- His .821 slugging percentage from last season gives him the highest career slugging percentage in program history, with a minimum of 200 at bats in White & Gold. It was the 4th highest slugging percentage in a single season by a Yellow Jacket, the best since 1926 and the first .800+ slugging season in 45 years (Tommy Thompson (.811) 1979).

- In 2023, Tech also set the program record for most triples in a single game on Feb. 17 vs. Miami (Ohio) with four.
- Tech also tied the program record for most doubles in a single game on March 14 vs. No. 18 Auburn with eight hitting six in the third inning alone.
- Tech looked true to form in again being one of the top powerhouse offenses in the ACC on Opening Weekend last year, setting the school record for runs scored on Opening Day (21).
- Part of the season-opening onslaught was seven home runs for Tech, the most in a single game since 2009.

FRESH BATS

- Kent Schmidt: Sophomore 1B. Started 56 games for Georgia Southern last year. Led the team in doubles (16) and walks (40).
- Nathan Waugh: Graduate Catcher/DH. 98 career games played at Cornell the last three seasons. Holds Cornell record with a 42-game on-base streak (which ended at 50 games) dating back to the 2023 season after reaching base in all 38 of Cornell's games last season.
- The seven freshmen will be looking to break into the GT lineup this year and continue the great legacy of success at the dish.
- Five of the freshmen hitters come from the state of Georgia with the only two exceptions being Drew Rogers (Tempe, Ariz) and Will Baker (Upper Coomera, Queensland, Australia).

MIDWEEK Highlights - The Bats - GT 15 - KSU 4

- Alex Hernandez hit his second grand slam of the season in the sixth inning to break the game open. It was his 8th HR of the season, tying him for the Division I lead among freshman.
- He now leads all Division I freshman with 37 RBI after driving in four tonight.
- **Hernandez** becomes the first Yellow Jacket with multiple grand slams in a single season since Matthew Ellis did so, last year.
- The Cumming, Ga. has tied his season-best hitting streak, now at seven games. Over this streak, he has hit three home runs and a triple for 16 RBI and 11 runs scored while drawing 10 walks.
- Shortstop Kyle Lodise extended his career-best on-base streak to 38 games dating back to his time at Augusta University.
- He laced a pair of bases clearing doubles, going 2-for-3 with 4 RBI, 3 runs scored and also drew two walks.
- This was his ninth multi-RBI game of the season and his third 4+ RBI game as a Yellow Jacket. His 28 RBI this season are third on the team behind **Hernandez** (37) and **Burress** (31).
- Caleb Daniel extended his hitting streak to six games with a towering 1st inning solo home run. He has scored a team-high 15 runs during this streak.
- The Cartersville product drew a season-high three walks, his second straight game with multiple walks as opposing pitching staffs begin to realize what he is capable of.
- This was his 3rd HR of the season, all coming during the hitting streak (last 6 games). Daniel is now tied with fellow freshman **Drew Rogers** in 4th place on the GT home run chart, behind **Lodise** (9), **Burress** (8) & **Hernandez** (8).
- Carson Kerce extended his career-long on-base streak to 16 games with a walk today. He came around to score twice, giving him 17 runs scored over his streak, dating back to Feb. 28 against Western Michigan.

- Will Baker extended his career-best on-base streak to six games, going 1-for-2 with two walks, an RBI and two runs scored.
- The Australian has recorded at least 1 RBI in each of his last four games, his only four starts on the season aside from opening day.
- Vahn Lackey extended his on-base streak to 30 games with a single in the nine-run sixth inning. That streak dates back to last season and is the longest of his career.
- **Drew Burress** has now reached base in a career-best 43 consecutive games dating back to April 28 of last season. He drove in his 31st RBI of the season in the sixth inning giving him 98 over his career at Georgia Tech.

- Junior shortstop **Kyle Lodise** had a career day, launching three home runs and a triple for 5 RBI on 4 hits, both career highs.
- He becomes the second ACC player to hit 3 HRs in a single game and the first Yellow Jacket to do so since **Drew Burress** set the program record with four against Georgia State last season (Feb. 28, 2024).
- Freshman **Caleb Daniel** matched **Burress** for the most runs scored by a GT freshman in an ACC game, rattling off five runs today on 4-for-5 hitting while finishing a triple shy of the cycle.
- Daniel launched his second home run of the season in the first inning, he hit homers in back-to-back ACC games after hitting his first-career HR in the 9th inning of Sunday's game against Pitt
- Sophomore Vahn Lackey extended his on-base streak to 27 games after connecting for an RBI single in the 1st That streak dates back to last season and is the longest of his career.
- Lackey finished with a career high four RBI off two singles, a groundout and a SAC fly.
- Freshman Alex Hernandez set new career-best with four runs scored tonight, drawing four walks and coming around to score each time.

- **Kerce** has scored 15 runs over his current 15 game on-base streak dating back to Feb. 28 against Western Michigan.
- Freshman Will Baker recorded his first-career mutti-hit game, going 2-for-5 and hitting the Jacket's only double.

- The Jackets return seven arms in total from last year's squad: McKee, Ballard, Patel, Riley Stanford, Jackson Sobel, Brett Barfield and Caden Gaudette
- The Jackets are heading into the second season under pitching coach **Matt Taylor** and **Jason Richman** as director of pitching. And head coach Hall has said he believes this to be the year that Tech fans witness "the fruits of their labor" as the pitching staff looks to prove people wrong in 2025.
- A whopping 21 new arms are joining the staff for the 2025 season, featuring a solid mix of 14 freshmen and seven transfers.

- Sam Swygert: Grad Transfer RHP from The Citadel. Pitched in 18 games and made 12 starts last season, pitching a team-high 67.1 innings with a 5.75 ERA.
- Caden Spivey: Junior RHP from Notre Dame. Made 15 appearances with three starts and 27.2 innings of work while going 1-1 with an 8.46 ERA
- **Porter Buursema:** Sophomore RHP from Georgia Southern. Made six starts, pitching 12.2 innings with 14 strikeouts, a 5.68 ERA and a 1-0 record

- **Brady Jones:** Junior RHP from Georgia State. Led the team with a 5-1 record last season, making 16 relief appearances and 1 start with a 7.32 ERA and 37 strikeouts over 39.1 innings. Most innings pitched out of GSU's bullben last season.

Spinning From The Start

- The Georgia Tech pitching staff got off to a historically strong start in 2025 - holding its opponents to fewer than five runs in each of its first six games for the first time since 2002.
- The pitching staff allowed nine runs over the course of the series, a 10-run improvement after averaging 19 runs allowed over the previous three opening series sweeps (14 RA in 2024, 24 RA in 2023 and 19 RA in 2022).
- The Jacket pitchers struck out 40 in the opening weekend against Old Dominion tied with 2022 for the most strikeouts through the first three games this century.
- In March, the Jackets allowed only three hits in back-to-back games against Georgia State (March 11) and Pitt (March 14) the first time Tech has allowed 3 or fewer hits in back-to-back games since a doubleheader against Duke in 2012 (March 31st 3 hits in game one / 2 hits in game two) those games featured a complete game shutout from Buck Farmer and 4.1 innings from Luke Bard both future major leaguers.

No PATEL-ing How Long This Will Last

- Senior RHP Mason Patel is simply put, the most effective pitcher in the ACC so far in 2025.
- The senior Georgia State transfer from two seasons ago leads the nation with six victories and leads the ACC with a 0.39 ERA and a 0.57 WHIP.
- He is one of only three pitchers in Division I to have surrendered only 1 run with 20+ innings pitched - also Ryan Bilka (Richmond) and Braeden Sloan (TCU).
- He became the first Yellow Jacket pitcher this century to win each of his first six starts.
- He was awarded ACC Co-Pitcher of the week on Feb. 24 after dominating both Marshall and Georgia Southern to the tune of 8.1 innings with a 0.00 ERA, 11 strikeouts and a 2-0 record while only allowing four base runners.
- Patel becomes the first GT pitcher to earn pitcher of the week since Andy Archer (March 29, 2021).
- Patel's award-winning week got started on Wednesday, when he came out of the bullpen to start the third inning in Tech's road opener at Georgia Southern. Patel was perfect through 5.1 innings, retiring the first 16 batters he faced in order to quiet the Georgia Southern bats and allow for Tech to take the game, 5-3. He struck out a career-best nine batters in that appearance, which also goes down as his longest outing in White & Gold Patel's longest since pitching 6.0 innings in a start against Brown for Georgia State back in 2023, all in only 50 pitches.
- He followed that with another gem of an outing on Sunday against Marshall, entering the game with runners on second and third and nobody out in the fifth inning, working around a hit-by-pitch to keep the Thundering Herd off the board with yet another scoreless inning. He would pitch two more scoreless to earn the victory, leaving after the 7th inning with the Jackets in front. 10-3.
- Patel's efforts bolstered a resurgent GT bullpen in 2025.
 The Tech bullpen has struck out 54 batter while holding opponents to a .180 average the best numbers by a Tech bullpen through seven games since at least the turn of the century.
- In his third appearance of the season, Patel entered in the sixth inning retiring the first batter he saw to get Tech into the 7th inning and earning the win and improving to 3-0 becoming the first Yellow Jacket pitcher to be 3-0 after only nine games since Xzavion Curry in 2018.
- Patel was first out of the bullpen vs. KSU, working a pair of flyouts to get Tech out of the second inning before striking out two around a couple of hits in the third and adding another K in the fourth around a two-out walk for 2.2 scoreless innings



- He would get credit for the win, improving to 4-0 on the season and becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn the win in each of his first four appearances since Mark Pope in 2011.
- Patel came out of the bullpen in the 5th inning of the series opener at VT and continued his unconscious season, pitching 4.2 innings without allowing a hit.
- Patel allowed only three base runners (one walk, one HBP, one ROE) and retiring 7 straight during the middle innings.
- He would get credit for the win, becoming the first Yellow Jacket to earn a win in each of his first five appearances since Kyle Bakker in 2002.
- Patel slammed the door yet again in Tech's last game (vs. GSU) pitching the final 3.0 innings and allowing only one base runner to secure his sixth victory in as many appearances, still without allowing a run.
- He came in to pitch the final three innings of the Saturday win against Pitt, earning his first save of the season. He gave up his first run of the year in the seventh inning, bringing his scoreless streak to an end at 22.2 innings to begin the year the best by any Tech pitcher this century.
- Last weekend, Patel came out on Saturday once again, pitching a career-best 6.2 innings the longest outing of any Yellow Jacket this season while striking out seven and throwing only 73 pitches.
- He entered the game at Notre Dame (March 22) in the third inning, coming in with the bases loaded, one out and a two-run lead (5-3). He proceeded to get a three-pitch strikeout before inducing an inning ending groundout to escape the jam and set the tone for what would be yet another dominant outing.
- He gave up one earned run on a solo homer, just his second earned run allowed over 29.2 innings of work.
- He is the only GT pitcher in the 21st century to earn a part of the decision in a each of his first eight appearances (seven wins, one save).

- Tech pitching has struck out 245 batters this season while only walking 95 for a K/BB ratio of 2.58 – the highest through 24 games since 2019.
- R-Soph. **Riley Stanford** made his sixth Sunday start of the season, pitching 3.0 innings and striking out three while only surrendering one earned run.
- R-Soph Caden Gaudette took over in the fourth inning, striking out two around a base hit. He has struck out at least one batter in all but one of his nine appearances this season, especially impressive when considering he has only thrown more than one inning on three of those appearances.
- Senior Jaylen Paden completely shut down the Notre Dame offense, pitching 3.0 innings and allowing only two base runners while striking out a season-high five.

Jim Poole Number - John Giesler

Georgia Tech baseball continues the legacy of former Yellow Jacket standout and Major League Baseball relief pitcher Jim Poole, who passed away from ALS in October of 2023, by designating a student-athlete each year to wear his No. 21 jersey. The student-athlete selected must exemplify Poole's characteristics both on and off the field.

This year, senior infielder John Giesler becomes the third Yellow Jacket to earn the honor, continuing the tradition begun by Jack Rubenstein in 2023 and Ben King last season.

"I am excited that John Giesler will wear number 21 this year," Head Coach Danny Hall said. "Jim Poole was part of an era in Georgia Tech Baseball that established us as a national power. Jim's prowess on the mound and in the classroom set the bar high for future Yellow Jacket players and teams. John exemplifies those same character traits of excellence on the field and in the classroom. As a two-time Captain he is the ultimate "Tech Man" to honor Jim's legacy."

Giesler, a sixth-year senior from Marietta, Ga. (Walton HS) will wear No. 21, having shown a longstanding commitment to Poole's ideals — self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field. Giesler is a five-time member of the ACC Academic Honor Roll, a two-time academic all-district honoree and earned Academic All-America (3rd Team) in 2023. He is currently pursuing a master's degree in real estate development.

On the diamond, Giesler is entering his second season as team captain. He is a career .308 hitter for the Yellow Jackets and set career highs in doubles (17), home runs (10) and RBI (43) last season while delivering a .990 fielding percentage in 41 games in the corner infield. He will be a key piece of the Jackets' offense again in 2025 as Tech strives for its 36th NCAA Regional berth and fifth in Giesler's career in White and Gold.

"Simply put, this is the greatest honor I have ever been given," Giesler said. "From knowing Jim and knowing who he was as a person, I don't feel deserving but I am incredibly honored. I will do everything I can this year to wear this number with respect and honor him and his family the best I can."

ABOUT JIM POOLE

Poole arrived on The Flats in 1985 and had an immediate impact, as Georgia Tech baseball would win the first of four-straight ACC Tournament Championships. During his four years, he pitched in 120 games and struck out 263 batters in 188 innings. He still ranks first in the Tech record book with 22 career saves, including 10 as a junior and nine as a senior. He was named all-ACC his last two seasons. Poole would be enshrined into the Georgia Tech Sports Hall of Fame just nine years later in 1997.

A stellar worker in the classroom, Poole elected not to turn professional after being selected in the 34th round of the 1987 MLB Draft by the LA Dodgers, and returned to Georgia Tech for his senior year, recording a 2.03 ERA and 113 strikeouts in only 71 innings. Once again, the LA Dodgers would call his name in the 1988 MLB Draft, this time taking him in the ninth round. He would return to

graduate from the Institute with a degree in electrical engineering in 1990.

Poole played 11 years in the major leagues, predominantly with the Baltimore Orioles, Cleveland Indians, and San Francisco Giants. In 431 games played, he finished with 22 victories and a 4.31 ERA, as well as 256 strikeouts and four saves. He helped pitch Cleveland to two American League Championship Series (1995, 1998), making it to the 1995 World Series where he would face the Atlanta Braves.

Following his retirement at the end of the 2000 season, Poole returned to Georgia Tech to join the Alexander-Tharpe Fund as a fundraiser and supporter of the baseball program. He then began serving as the pitching coach at Johns Creek High School in 2010, teaching many young men about pitching mechanics, while also conveying his personal pitching philosophy.

He later joined the business world as a Personal Wealth Advisor for the Baseball Division of BIP Wealth.

After being diagnosed with ALS in 2021, Poole worked tirelessly to raise awareness for the disease. In addition to serving on MLB ALS boards, he also worked with Georgia Tech, who together hosted an ALS Awareness Day during the 2022 baseball season, with Tech wearing Jim Poole shirts and both teams wearing honorary wristbands. Professional players also wore the shirt. Tech later designated the number 21 each year to be worn by a student-athlete who exemplify Poole's ideals – self-determination, a strong academic work ethic, and high moral fiber on and off the field.

Every 90 minutes, someone is diagnosed with ALS, or Lou Gehrig's disease, with an estimated 30,000 people living with ALS in the United States at any given time. Primarily affecting people between the ages of 40 and 70, ALS is a progressive neurodegenerative disease that affects nerve cells in the brain and the spinal cord. There is no known cure.

2025 ACC TOURNAMENT

Beginning this spring with the 2025 ACC Baseball Championship in Durham, North Carolina, all 16 teams in the ACC will compete in a single-elimination championship. The championship will remain six days as it has in previous years, running from Tuesday, May 20, through Sunday, May 25, 2025, from Durham Bulls Athletic Park.

"There's once again tremendous excitement surrounding ACC Baseball and today's announcement will bring an improved championship experience for our student-athletes, coaches, and fans alike," stated ACC Commissioner Jim Phillips Ph.D. "Nationally, the ACC is once again well-represented in the preseason polls and award lists. After what we know will be a highly competitive regular season, we look forward to showcasing all 16 baseball teams in Durham this May."

Since 2006, the ACC Baseball Championship has been played in a pool play or round-robin style format. The tournament last expanded its field size in 2017, moving from 10 to 12 teams.

Under the new format, the top four seeds in the championship will be based off the performance in the regular season and will receive a double-bye into the quarterfinal round, which is scheduled to be held on Thursday and Friday. Seeds five through eight will earn a bye into Wednesday's second round. Seeds 9-16 will begin play with four first round games on Tuesday.



LET'S BRAG ABOUT BURRESS

"Burress is as big a star as you'll find in college baseball, the reigning D1Baseball Freshman of the Year and a 2024 first-team All-American after hitting .381/.512/.821 with 25 homers. He's a no-brainer first-team preseason All-American as a sophomore, and our preseason pick for ACC Player of the Year.

D1Baseball

- In 2024, Drew Burress established himself as one of the best hitters in college baseball and one of the most exciting prospects to watch leading up to the 2026 draft. If he can continue his historic run through the ranks of NCAA Baseball, every MLB front office will be begging for Burress to become the next face of the franchise.
- Burress hit 25 home runs last season, one shy of the Georgia Tech program record (set by Kevin Parada in 2022) and two shy of the NCAA freshman home run record set by Tommy White (NC State) in 2022 as well.

- Burress can claim to have an unofficial piece of the GT home run record since he hit a home run against Georgia that would ultimately not be recorded officially after the game was ended due to rain.
- Last year, Burress became the 1st Yellow Jacket to ever slug over .800 with at least 200 at bats. His .821 slugging percentage led all Division I freshman and 6th overall among those with 200+ ABs.
- Not only did Burress turn heads with his bat but he also set the Georgia Tech record for the most assists by an outfielder in a single season, gunning down 10 runners from his spot in center field.

- This season, Burress has placed an emphasis on showing off his base running. After stealing 8 bags on 10 attempts last year, Burress feels that his speed isn't getting enough attention & looks to amend that in 2025.

• **Danny Hall** is in his 32nd season at Georgia Tech and his 38th overall as a head coach in 2025. He is the winningest baseball coach in Tech history with 1,214 wins.

• Hall, who won his 1,400th career game on April 14, 2024 and his 1,200th win at Georgia Tech on May 12, 2024, stands second among active Division I coaches in career victories entering the 2025 season.

- Prior to the 2024 season, Hall was named to the ABCA Hall of Fame.
 - In his career both as an assistant and head coach
 Hall has been part of over 1,600 victories and seven trips to the College World Series.
- Hall has led Tech to the NCAA Tournament on 22 occasions and guided the Jackets to the NCAA College World Series in 1994, 2002 and 2006 -- the program's only three berths.
- He announced on March 27th that 2025 will be his final year on The Flats. Closing the book on one of the greatest careers in college baseball history




